

LOUISIANA LEGAL UPDATE **OIL & GAS LAW DEVELOPMENTS CASES OF INTEREST**

Court Deals With Rejection by MMS of Assignee of OCS Lease and Effect on Liability

Post-Assignment Assignee for Operations.

A company ("Unocal") proposed certain operations to the other working interest owners of a mineral lease (the "Lease") covering a block located on the Outer Continental Shelf (the "OCS") offshore of Louisiana. One the parties ("IP") had sold its interest to a third party ("Chevenne"), but continued to hold record title pending approval by the Minerals Management Service ("MMS"). Unocal sent various notices to Cheyenne and Cheyenne made various elections with respect to the proposed operations, and then undertook same. Subsequently, the MMS rejected Cheyenne as an assignee. Unocal filed suit against Cheyenne for unpaid costs and expenses. When Chevenne defended on the basis that it was not a working interest party, Unocal amended its suit to include IP as a party defendant. The trial court found for Unocal against IP on a

motion for summarv judgment. The Third Circuit reversed on the basis that there were material issues of fact and remanded to the trial court. Union Oil Co. of Cal. v. Chevenne Oil. 839 So.2d 1170 (La. App. 3d Cir. 2003).

The facts of the case are somewhat complicated and since the court was dealing with a for motion summarv judgment, they may not be exactly as set out in the opinion. In any event, it appears that Unocal was a working interest owner in the Lease when it received a proposal from the operator to plug and abandon the well located thereon. Unocal responded with its own proposal to conduct downhole operations to restore and/or

interest at auction through the Oil and Gas Clearinghouse and the successful bidder was Cheyenne. At the time the proposal was sent out, the MMS had not approved Chevenne as a party eligible to receive an interest in an OCS Lease. Nonetheless, it appears that when Unocal was notified of the sale, it sent all subsequent proposals and elections to Chevenne.


The operations undertaken by Unocal proved to be unsuccessful and Unocal then proceeded to plug and abandon the well. Chevenne in the meantime had been rejected by the MMS and the assignment was not approved. Chevenne did not pay the costs and expenses invoiced them by Unocal and so Unocal filed suit. Cheyenne's defense was that since the assignment was not approved, it did not own an interest, and therefore could not be a party to the JOA. If it were not a party to the JOA, the argument went that it could not be liable for those

While the trial court found for Unocal against IP. the court of appeal found that there were two issues of fact that precluded a summary judg-First, Unocal ment. alleged that IP never transferred its working (presumably interest because the assignment was rejected). Secondly, there was an issue as to whether IP had actually received copies of the proposals and invoices that were sent Chevenne. If not, this apparently offered defense to IP based upon the language of the JOA. Accordingly, the court of appeal reversed and remanded this matter back to the trial court.

In any event, the case is a reminder that an assignment of an interest in a lease that is subject to subsequent events is not final until those events have been satisfied. Treating the purchaser as the owner of that interest prior to the satisfaction of the contingency can cause a number of problems, including the instant one of who is the responsible party. In such a case, an operator may have to evaluate the situation and determine whether to require additional assurances that the assignee (or the assignor) will be responsible for all costs and expenses of the post-assignment operations regardless of whether the assignment is approved.

The above case does not appear to be final as of yet. In the event the holding of this case is changed upon further appeal, we will advise in a future article.
