ingly, the courts involved all found the Commissioner did not violate any of the above. The Court pointed out that the

Commissioner has the authority to establish compulsory units and designate unit operators therefore and cited the Louisiana Supreme Court decision in *Hunt Oil Co. v. Batchelor*, 644 So. 2d 191 (La. 1994).

In addition to pointing out the Commissioner's discretion, the Court appeared to approve of the decision that was actually reached. The Court pointed out that EnerQuest had not indicated any intention to drill or rework the Unit wells, and that Will-Drill had represented that it would undertake operations to restore unit production from the Unit wells. The evidence was that Will-Drill was now the owner of 63.53% in one unit, and 87.87% in the other unit; it made sense to the Court that a party owning such an interest would be more willing to undertake drilling or reworking operations than a company (EnerQuest) that had minimal mineral ownership interests in

these Units (since a good portion of the original leases had terminated). Indeed, the evidence seemed to indicate that if EnerQuest remained the Unit Operator, the wells would be plugged and abandoned. In the words of the Court, they were "an operator who was not operating, which in turn is wasteful to the other interested owners who are not recovering anything from a well that has a potential to produce recoverable reserves if reworked."

It is unclear from the recitation of facts in the decision why EnerQuest resisted being replaced as unit operator. They

An oil and gas company was appointed operator by the Louisiana Commissioner of Conservation (the "Commissioner") of certain wells designated as the unit wells for certain conservation units (the "Units"). The unit wells initially produced but then at some point went off production for an extended period of time. Another company ("Will-Drill") took new leases covering the overwhelming majority of the unit acreage and filed an application to be appointed the new operator of the Units. The existing operator ("EnerQuest") objected at the hearing but the Commissioner appointed the new company as operator, in part, because it was currently the majority working interest owner and it had specific plans to rework the unit wells. EnerQuest filed suit in district court to contest the Commissioner's order: however. the trial court dismissed the suit and upheld the

action of the Commissioner. EnerQuest then appealed to the First Circuit Court of Appeal. This appeal was denied in EnerQuest Oil and Gas, L.L.C. v. Asprodites, 2003 La. App. Lexis 811 (Decided 04/02/03).

It is settled that the Commissioner has broad authority to decide issues that come within his juris-The Commisdiction. sioner's order may be reversed only if his decision prejudices substantial rights because it violates constitutional or statutory law, exceeds his statutory authority involves arbitrary or capricious abuse of discretion or the like. Not surpris-

may have had other plans for these wells (i.e. to utilize them for other purposes or to pull the casing); however, the record does not articulate what those plans would have been. They apparently maintained that once a party has been appointed operator, he may not be removed, at least not if the new potential operator merely wishes to re-enter the unit well (as opposed to drilling new wells). Additionally, they appeared to object to any evidence being taken as to the relative ownership interests in the units involved. Finally, they appear to have argued that allowing Will-Drill to utilize the existing unit wells was an unconstitutional taking of their property (the well bores, casing, etc.). As to this latter argument, the Court held that the ownership was beyond the scope of their decision; they were opining only as to the propriety of the Commissioner's actions in allowing Will-Drill to use them as Unit Operator.

As noted above, we have not confirmed that the case is final. If the decision is subsequently reversed, we will advise you in a future newsletter.

## Court of Appeal Follows Corbello Decision in Awarding \$2 Million to Landowner for Property worth \$304,000

Landowner filed suit against oil company for failure to restore the surface of the property, and alleged this breached the oil and gas lease covering the property (*the "Lands"*). The jury determined the Lands to be worth \$304,000, but awarded \$2 Million

in damages as the cost to restore the surface. The Third Circuit Court of Appeal affirmed this decision. Hazelwood Farm, Inc. v. Liberty Oil and Gas Corporation, 2003 La. App. Lexis 797 (La. App. 3 Circ. 04/02/03).

The Court of Appeal specifically cited the recent Louisiana Supreme Court case of *Corbello v. Iowa Production*, 02-0826 (La. 02/25/03), and discussed its holding. The Court noted that there was evidence that the landowner would not use the damage award to restore the Lands but that was irrelevant. The Court pointed out that the damages to property in a breach of contract suit is governed by the contract, and it is not limited by the value of the property.

To name but a few - Jon Emerson, FASLA, Landscape Architect, prepared the Botanical Garden Master Plan, Lake Douglas, PhD, Exhibition curator, Landscape Architect and Garden Historian, Exhibition Planting by the Botanical Garden Committee, and Paul M. Soniat, Director, New Orleans Botanical Garden.

Paul Soniat and Mrs. Morrell F. (Genevieve) Trimble, President of the New Orleans Botanical Garden Foundation, welcomed guests to the inauguration, with the following statement...

"It is with pleasure that we welcome you to this horticultural exhibition featuring plants of the Louisiana Purchase as part of the community-wide celebration of its Bicentennial. The exhibit also marks the inauguration of the PLANO Garden, the newest garden space in the New Orleans Botanical Garden.

We hope you will enjoy your visit and, while here, will take time to stroll at leisure through the other parts of the Botanical Garden to admire and become acquainted with this charming landmark garden in City Park.

Over 10 years ago, we began an ambitious undertaking to restore this Garden, which was originally created during the WPA era of the 1930s. Our redevelopment plan is still in progress as we seek to complete the final phase of our beautiful, newlydedicated Conservatory of the Two Sisters.




